Comments:
Graded Agency:
Department of Defense (DoD) prime contracting provides our warfighters with the best possible technologies and other capabilities in an effort to deter war and protect our national interests worldwide. In accordance with the "Better Buying Power 2.0" initiatives, DoD continues its commitment to small businesses with an increased focus on training for small business professionals and identifying opportunities for small businesses in defense acquisitions through market research, competition, and subcontracting. Many of DoD's largest prime contracts are for aircraft, ships, etc., which are complex and costly. Though these sophisticated procurements are considered "mail businesses eligible," small businesses generally do not have the infrastructure or capacity to perform such requirements while staying within the existing size standards. Despite these challenges, and operating in an environment of uncertainty created by sequestration and Government furloughs, DoD has demonstrated a commitment to small business utilization to the maximum extent practicable. Additionally, DoD improved its small business performance for FY 2013, with an overall achievement of 21.09 percent, up from 20.41 percent in FY 2012.
